# McLean Memory Care Capital Campaign

2022 was a transformational year, as we completed the McLean Memory Care Capital Campaign, raising \$5.5 million, held a special celebration to dedicate the new state-of-the-art center and welcomed residents living with dementia through these doors in August. We also continued the grand affairs with the unveiling of the donor mural in the McLean Center in April 2023.

In order to have a successful Capital Campaign, you need a significant lead gift to inspire others. Knowing Arlene and Lewis McLean have always been so generous giving to our annual appeal and our planned giving program, we shared the memory care plans with Arlene to seek her support. Arlene, with the spirit of Lewis and their combined philanthropic way of life, was encouraged by our plans and quickly expressed her interest in supporting the Memory Care Center campaign. In fact, we were overwhelmed by the unprecedented magnitude of her generosity. It is truly a transformational gift to Meadowood, which provided the name for this uniquely designed facility – the McLean Memory Care Center. We thank Arlene for this magnanimous contribution that will forever embed the legacy of Lewis and Arlene McLean into our community.

Arlene's lead gift provided the necessary beginning of our Memory Care Capital Campaign and inspired others to support the campaign, including her brother, Larry Andrews. The love of gardening and the giving spirit were two attributes instilled in Arlene and Larry from their parents. It was no surprise that Larry was ecstatic about the two beautiful courtyards within the Memory Care Center, and he named one of the courtyards in memory of their parents and named the other courtyard in memory of his wife. Residents, their families, and staff members will find peace in these serene gardens for years to come. We thank Larry for honoring his parents and wife in such a meaningful and thoughtful way.

Along with Arlene and Larry, we were thrilled to have nine additional significant donors who supported the campaign at a high level: Paul and Grayce Anderson, Walt and Judy Barnes, Helene Bocclair, Joan and John Bown, Carole and Joseph Christ, Al and Barbara Gabriele, Dianne and Robert Greer, The Family of John Rooney, Jeffrey and Barbara Ost. All were honored and recognized during the donor mural dedication ceremony, and their legacy will forever live on, as their names are inscribed on lily pad tiles within the magnificent tile mural in the McLean Memory Care Center. Side panels were also unveiled with the names of all donors who contributed \$5,000 and above. We are appreciative of ALL 118 gifts of various sizes to the campaign, that helped make it a great success.

Since opening the doors in August 2022, thanks to the generosity of our donors, Meadowood has served 27 residents and their family members. We are thrilled that residents are thriving in their new home, and families are happy with the environment and excellent care their loved ones are receiving. McLean families are engaged with quarterly family nights/support groups, which includes hospitality, socialization, and support. Because of the special setting, staff is able to provide enhanced programming, including a busy calendar of eight to ten programs per day, including: strength training, yoga, tai chi, music, spiritual, pet visits, cognitive, creative, and horticulture. The dining staff has provided an exceptional program, including special brunches for residents and family members and incorporating herbs and produce that were grown in one of the courtyard gardens. The staff who engage with residents living with dementia is provided with comprehensive education in order to provide an exceptional experience. Over 20 staff members have been trained at the champion level, there are eight coaches, and three trainers have been trained.

None of this would be possible without the donors who contributed to this comprehensive campaign. Thank you for being visionaries and philanthropic leaders at Meadowood.

# Stewardship

Thank you for choosing Meadowood to be the recipient of your charitable giving. Meadowood celebrates the commitment of our donors and volunteers, who give their time, talents, and treasures by being good stewards of the gifts we receive. Our responsible planning and management of resources allows us to continue to advance our mission, and we are genuinely appreciative of your generosity and trust in us.

Since 2009, when the formal philanthropy program began at Meadowood, donors have generously contributed gifts and bequests of over \$12.5 million to Meadowood, with \$1.1 million cash received in 2022. These donations allow us to continue to enhance our mission to provide the highest quality of life for all who experience the Meadowood community.

**Benevolence Fund** – Donations have been designated to the Benevolence Fund throughout our history, which has been our support for the Meadowood Benevolence Policy – allowing residents to remain at Meadowood when outliving their assets or experiencing unexpected financial challenges. The Benevolence Policy gives residents peace of mind.

**Memory Care Campaign** - The majority of charitable gifts in 2022 were dedicated to the McLean Memory Care Center. The successful campaign raised \$5.5 million in cash and pledges. The project honors our mission, vision, and core values, especially service excellence and the highest quality healthcare in a secure and comfortable environment.

**Other Restricted Gifts** – Your restricted gifts enhanced many programs and areas of campus, demonstrating your commitment in helping to make Meadowood such an inspiring community. Besides gifts to the Memory Care campaign, the largest restricted gifts were designated for the putting green and croquet court. These wellness enhancements are welcome additions to our campus, as many residents are enjoying them.

Another restricted donation funded a dazzling firework display during Meadowood's second annual Flügel Fest. Both residents and staff enjoyed this festive and fun community event.

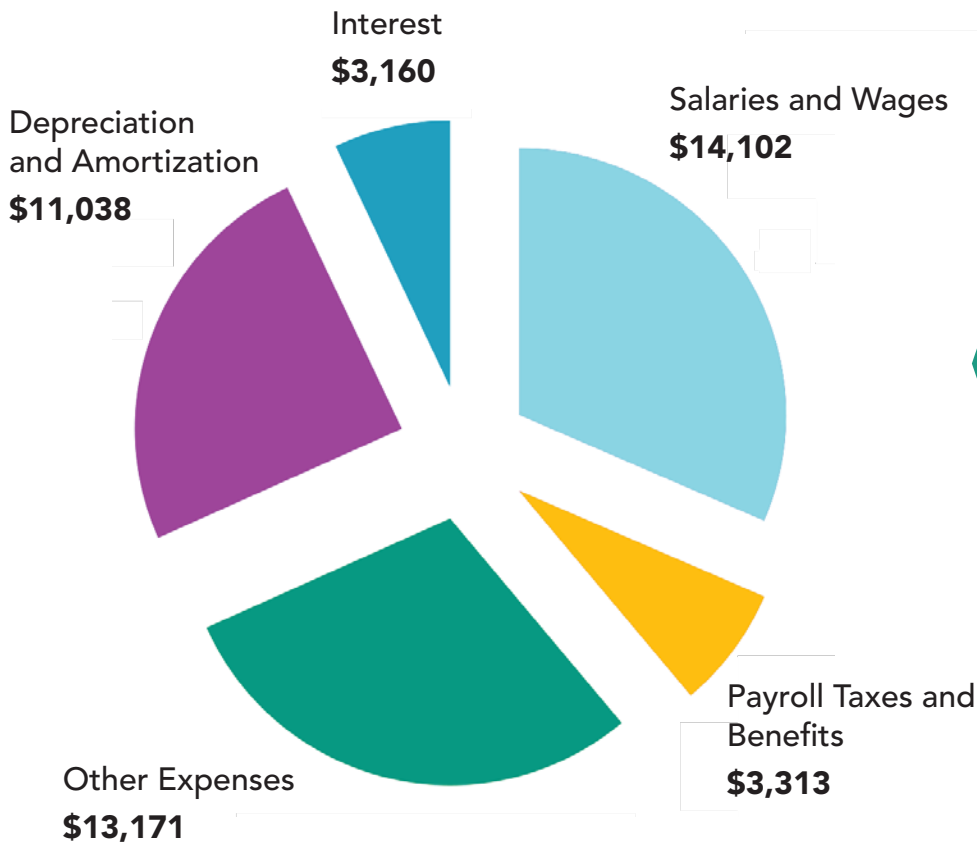
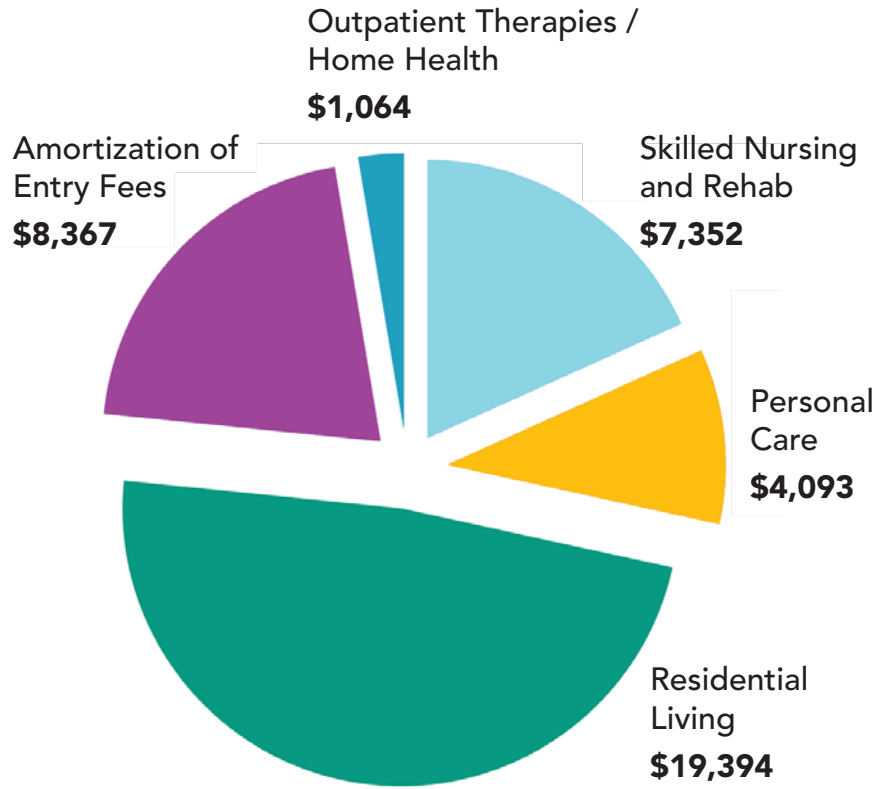

# Community Advancement Committee

The Community Advancement Committee continues with its charter responsibilities: fundraising and outreach, on behalf of the Meadowood community. The many areas of outreach, which include first responders, various local schools and organizations promoting those in need, promote Meadowood as a responsible partner – gaining visibility as a good citizen. We plan to increase such activities in our plan for the next year.

Fundraising continues to reflect the Meadowood culture of philanthropy, as residents support continues in many ways each year. While the Capital Campaign for the McLean Center was still active in 2022, receiving over \$700,000 in cash, various other types of donations were received for a total of over \$400,000. These include gifts to the annual appeal, charitable gift annuities, art show, tribute gifts, and restricted gifts – including the Benevolence Fund. We are truly grateful for this remarkable achievement of resident support for various needs at Meadowood.

Over the past fourteen years, over \$12.5 million in cash has been generated from these activities:

Since the beginning, being a good neighbor has been a hallmark of our community. This value is reflected today by the many residents who volunteer on committees, in the Health Center, or in the greater community. Resident volunteers create, organize, and fund over sixty committees, which address the interests, social enrichment, and educational needs of residents. Some examples include bocce and billiards, ceramics and crafts, current events, organizing over 30 entertainment programs, bridge and other games nights, and the resident newsletter. Resident volunteers provide major assistance for the juried Art Show, Gosling's Nest gift shop, and Hidden Treasures thrift shop – all of which raise money.



In conjunction with the Chaplain, Meadowood residents participate in mission outreach to help fulfill needs of the greater community, including making peanut and butter jelly sandwiches for a local food bank. Residents also serve the greater community by individually volunteering in their church communities, at local hospitals and schools, and for other worthy causes.

Resident volunteers also brighten the lives of Health Center residents by paying friendly visits, providing pet therapy, helping with activities, providing entertainment, delivering mail and water, and transporting residents to and from therapy.

While this Annual Report is mainly all about residents' financial support, clearly Meadowood is fortunate to have a wonderful group of dedicated volunteers who are generous with giving of their treasures as well as volunteering their time and talents.
